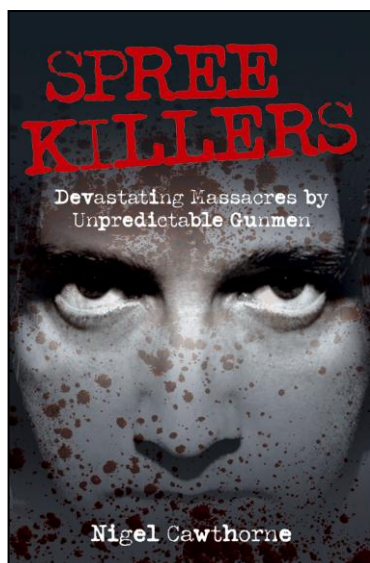

'We are all in danger. When we go to school or work, go out shopping or just walk down the street, a bullet aimed at random might cut us down. Nowhere is safe from the mad gunman who simply wants to kill a large number of people without rhyme or reason, before killing themselves.'

An investigation into spree killing that analyses the psychology of a chilling and relatively new phenomenon. **Nigel Cawthorne** carefully examines each case in the book and shows how the killers first suppress their rage and violent fantasies until a small incident sparks off their fatal rampage.

The cases include that of Michael Ryan, who slew sixteen in the quiet English town of Hungerford; Wade Frankum, who went berserk with a rifle in a shopping plaza in Sydney, Australia; teenage students Eric Harris and Dylan Klebold and their killing spree at Columbine High School in Colorado, USA; and Seung-Hui Cho, responsible for the Virginia Tech massacre, the deadliest shooting frenzy by a single gunman in the history of the USA.

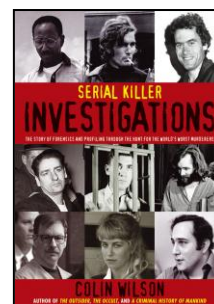
